#### A Note From the Rabbi



Summer and Fall

For many of us, summer is a time when there is a change of pace in our lives, when children are out of school and perhaps off to camp, when we go on vacation, and immerse ourselves in baseball. For my family, the highlight of the summer was going to Camp Coleman. Both of our kids got to be campers for a full week—experiencing Jewish summer camp in its fullness for the first time. After returning, Ezra happily declared camp to be better than a Disney cruise – high praise from any young child.

Our kids' happy experiences weren't out of the ordinary. Camp Coleman brings nearly a thousand kids from all over Georgia, Florida, and other nearby places over the course of the summer. Other nearby Jewish camps, such as Camp Barney and Six Points, also bring in lots of kids for the summer. And these summers are, to use a cliché, amazing. While I was there, they put me hard at work being a referee for capture the flag, judging synchronized swimming, leading worship services, and teaching about Judaism. perhaps the best part of it all was seeing kids be kids. Camp Coleman has a strict "no technology" rule for campers - they're not allowed to have

phones, Nintendo switches, or anything of the sort. The result? As kids were largely disconnected from devices and the outside world, they built meaningful and wonderful connections with each other. And they discovered the joys of camp, friendship, and their Jewish tradition. Whether it was seeing kids completing art projects, playing sports, reading a book, or joining in a lively, musical service or song session, Camp felt filled with life. For anyone thinking of sending their children to sleepaway camp, I highly recommend it.

Whatever we did over the last few months, though, summer is soon going to give way to fall. In the Jewish calendar, that means Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah are around the corner. These are times of renewal, yet our tradition emphasizes that renewal is a process, not a moment. We contribute to our renewal in many ways - whether it's time away over the summer, the observance of Shabbat, making a new friend, reading a new book, entering a new class and grade at school, and so on. The High Holy Days encourage us to focus on our renewal so that we don't get stuck in life, so that we're not satisfied with the status quo, so that we can realize that things can improve, whether that means society or our personal lives.

As we end summer and move into the new Jewish year of 5784, may we all be blessed with renewal and rejuvenation. May the year ahead be filled with blessings and goodness.





#### **News from TKC President Seth Litman**



#### TKC Music

As you likely know, TKC has been in search of a permanent musical accompanist solution for many months. At the outset of this search, I asked members and others that are knowledgeable about our temple and heavily involved in our music programming to participate in a committee to identify and help hire our next musical accompanist. The members of that amazing and hardworking committee, which is chaired by Eric Simon and Lori Dreffin, are Steve Best, Gigi Morton, Carolyn Figiel, Michelle Erste and, of course, Rabbi Holtz. These folks have endeavored to identify candidates and have spent many hours interviewing applicants trying to fill our open position. You have seen some of the fruits of their labor in two candidates who participated in Friday night services. Unfortunately, neither of those individuals worked out.

A little bit of background. For many years, Temple Kehillat Chaim followed the traditional clergy model and had a Rabbi and Cantor. In the early to mid 2010's the trend in temples was to move away from a traditional Cantor and towards using musical accompanists/cantorial soloists. The Board at the time decided that it would pursue this trend for a number of reasons, and it split the role into two individuals—a musical accompanist for the religious school, Friday nights, B'nai Mitzvahs, and ordinary holidays, and a traditional Cantor just for the High Holidays. This model worked well for the first few years of the arrangement, but it became much more challenging once our musical accompanist Morgan Rubin left. As a result, we decided to unify the position into a single person. Unfortunately, though, we have been unable to find someone to lead our

overall music program, run the adult choir all year, engage our students in the religious school and youth choir, and be present for and a participant in B'nai Mitzvahs.

Jewish music is a vital part of what we do at the Kehillah. The emotions – from serious to fun to meaningful memories – that are provoked by our music is real and important. Think about how you feel when our cellist plays "Kol Nidre" at Yom Kippur, when you attend services and the congregation sings the Amidah in unison, or when our youth loudly sings (and sometimes dances to) camp-style prayers that they learned at Coleman or Barney. For this reason, one of my major goals this year is to re-solidify our music at TKC.

In light of our lack of success identifying and hiring a musical accompanist, the search committee has been authorized to open the search to candidates that are ordained Cantors. Although this will require a more involved process, I think it is in the best interest of our temple to have someone at the helm of TKC's music programming that creates a consistency through our religious school, in our services, and at the High Holidays. I further expect this person to become an intricate part of the fabric of our Kehillah.

To be sure, the hiring of a part-time, ordained Cantor will be a difficult thing to do, and we will continue to consider other musical accompanists if they apply. Further, hiring an ordained Cantor, even part time, will further test the limits of our budget and will require some fund raising to ensure its success. So, be on the lookout for a call from members of the board for your participation. But, if we are able to identify the right candidate that is an ordained Cantor, we think it will be the best thing for the long-term success of our temple. Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions or comments.




