

A Note From the Rabbi



**CHAG SUKKOT
SAMEACH!**

On Rosh Hashanah morning, I gave a sermon on how changing technology affects our lives and the Jewish community in particular. One example that I gave was how technology affected the way food is produced and consumed, with humanity gradually going from eating what they could find or hunt, to farming, and eventually to where we are today — with access to a huge variety of foods from anywhere in the world, many times regardless of the time of the year. Because of this, famines are largely unheard of in many parts of the world.

This month, Jews mark the autumn harvest festival of Sukkot. Gratitude to God for food, and also praying for rain in the year to come, is a central focus of Sukkot. Additionally, we construct temporary shelters used by the ancient Israelites called Sukkot after they fled from Egyptian slavery. All year round, we pray to God for a Sukkah Shalom, a shelter of peace. And so, on the festival of Sukkot, we are particularly sensitive to our need and everyone's need for food, shelter and peace.

These three needs are all linked. Despite technological advancements and supply chains that are alleviating hunger, a lack of food is still a major concern for many. In 2019, the World Health Organization estimated that well over 800 million people around the world are hungry. Additionally, Mazon: A Jewish Response to Hunger states, "Hunger is as prevalent as it is pernicious. It is not restricted only to third world countries or

homeless people, but has increasingly become the province of families in highly industrialized nations, including the United States and Israel." They estimate that 1 in 8 Americans struggle with hunger. Unlike famines during most periods of human history, though, the problem is not primarily a shortage of food. Rather, conflicts and other political problems contribute significantly, though there are still people who lack adequate food and water in relatively peaceful and stable parts of the world. Still, a Sukkot Shalom would go a long ways to eliminating hunger for many.

Over Sukkot, as we thank God for having plenty of food, we can show our gratitude by helping others. We cannot unilaterally stop wars, or solve other problems that cause hunger, but we can each do a small part to help out. Rabbi Tarfon, who lived nearly two thousand years ago, said, "It is not up to you to do everything, but you must do something." One option worth considering is to support charities that effectively work to end hunger, such as the [Atlanta Community Food Bank](#) or [Mazon](#). This Sukkot, and always, let our gratitude be expressed through our generosity and concern.



News from the Mitzner Family Religious School

It has been a busy month for the Mitzner Family Religious School! This month we continued our virtual religious school with a Mitzvah Day for all grades and a family High Holy Day project that walked through the concepts of t'shuva (forgiveness), t'filah (prayer), and tz'dakah (righteous giving). We have had great engagement and participation and are so happy each Sunday to see your students' smiling faces on Zoom!

Earlier in September, we asked our parents to provide feedback on returning to in-person learning. After hearing feedback and concerns, we made the decision to remain virtual for both Judaics and Hebrew for the remainder of 2020. This decision is not made lightly. In consideration of our families' concerns, specifically related to secular school re-opening and our understanding that some of our families travel a pretty far distance for just one hour of class, we think that remaining virtual will be the safest and most prudent path forward. We also understand the desire by many to return to in-person learning and regain a sense of normalcy, however, the numbers in our community do not lend themselves to gathering from disparate communities across the metro area when the risk of sharing the virus remains so high.

We hope that all our families understand that this decision was made using facts, input from medical professionals, and the needs of our community in mind. We will re-evaluate in-person learning in January and hope to be back in the classroom with your students then!

In response to those families who wanted to have in-person options, we will be providing two opportunities for families to gather in-person, if they choose, at our Community Learning Events on October 4th (for Sukkot) and November 1st (for Thanksgiving).

Our first Community Learning Event will be on October 4th from 9 am to 1 pm and will be a craft session to decorate our sukkah! Pick a timeslot on our sign-up (bit.ly/SukkotCraft) and join us for an hour of crafting. We will follow strict safety protocols, including:

- We will be taking temperatures and providing hand sanitizer upon arrival.
- All attendees MUST wear masks. If you do not feel comfortable wearing a mask the entire time, please do not sign up to attend.
- Families MUST remain socially distant from other families during your time at the event.
- Only one family will be allowed into the sukkah at a time to hang their crafts.
- We will sanitize all materials and work areas between shifts/families.
- Please do not bring food to this event.
- We will be limiting entrance into the building so please plan to use the restroom before you arrive.

Also, on the same day, October 4th, PJ Library is hosting a great Sukkot-themed mobile scavenger hunt event starting at 2 pm. Families will meet at a designated time and location, then caravan in their own cars to different synagogues and Jewish Organizations around North Fulton. Each stop will have a sign that families will search for. Each sign will have a QR code containing a link to a video about that organization and a special clue leading to the next stop. For precautionary reasons, only one family at a time is allowed out of their car. Once families reach the final stop, they will receive a special Sukkot activity box for participating. Even if you don't feel comfortable coming to the in-person craft day, we encourage families who feel comfortable to participate in the scavenger hunt!
